She was a constant member of the Methodist E. Church for 44 years and until death. Her husband and three children survive her. Her children are Mrs. Charles W. Mercer, living near Elliott, Mrs William H Ellenwood and Mrs Sarah Jane Beals. Mrs Stipe was one of the pioneers of this county. She knew the privileges of pioneer life, patiently toiled and lived to enjoy the fruits of a life of toil. Ann and William raised her sister Pauline's child Mary Emmeline McClary after Pauline died. Mary married Valentine Ackerman at the Stipe home Sept 27, 1871. Ann was mid-wife delivering baby's and mending folks of Milford (Grant) Iowa, was said she always had her basket medical supplies ready at all times. Ann died of Coley Morbis.

Obituary... Alexander Caywood was born April 11, 1833 and departed this life on February 8th, 1911, at his home near Barnard, Mo. at The age of se venty--seven years, nine months and 28 days. He came to Iowa in 1856 and settled near Grant, where he lived until 1893 he moved to a farm at ren o, in Cass county, and resided there; until last March, when he sold his farm and bought near Barnard, Mo. In 1861, he was married to Catherine El Porter, and to them were born nine children, four of whom with the mother, have preceded him to the other World. John Caywood of MT. Etna, I A, Madison Caywood of Maitland, Mo., Myra Caywood, and Oscar of Skidmore, Mo. and Frank Caywood of Barnard, Mo. are the children living, While two of his brother and one sister, nineteen grandchildren and one great -grandchild are the immediate relatives living. Mr. Caywood was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church at Reno, on the Cumberland Charge, where he was converted under the pastorate of Rev. S.E. Brown, in 1894, and was faithful to the pastor and church until his death. It was said th at no pastor ever left the Charge unpaid, while he was a member of the church. To one of his pastors he often lamented that he had not begun a Christian life while a young man. When informed that he must die, he expressed himself as being ready to go, saying that he was not afraid to die, as he believed all had been forgiven and on February 8th he fell asleep to awake no more on the earth., His remains were brought to Grant, and the funeral preached in the Methodist Episcopal Church by former pastor, Rev. J. W. stokesbury, from Gal. 6:7 and his remains laid in the family plot at the Cemetery, Grant, Iowa.

She was of the eleven charter member of the Methodist Church of Elliot t, was communion steward for forty years, and the first president of the W oman;s Home Missionary Society her. All these years of Service only pro ve her loyalty

and devotion to the Great Cause.

She is mother of six children Mrs. Ida M. Johnson of Red Oak, Iowa; Benjamin Franklin Mercer of Ainsworth, Neb.; Mrs. Jennie Pogue, Mrs Carrie Redmon, William and Jesse E. Mercer of Elliott; also sixteen grandchildren who dearly love and respect her and are grieved at their loss. Though in many months, she was always Brave, cheerful and uncomplaining and much deserved the reward which is hers. She departed this life on Friday morning June 20, 1924 at 4:45 o'clock, at the age of 74 years, 9 months and 2 days. Orley While in charge of the services, read the sketch of Mrs. Stewart's life, which she wrote for that purpose. It follows: "I was born Sarah Jane Stipe on March 22nd, 1852 near Clarinda, Iowa, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Stipe. My childhood and youth were spent on the old Stipe homestead farm, one quarter mile south of Grant and which is now owned by Fred Kenworthy. I was educated in the Grant Public schools, qualified myself as a teacher, attending teachers institute in the Villisca Baptist Church, and for a number of years taught in the public schools of Grant and Vicinity. "I was Married to Ephriam Beals on March 11, 1876 at Grant, after which for twenty years, I resided on what is generally known as "Indian Farm" a short distance northeast of Grant, Mr. Beals passed away in January 1892. to this union four children were born: Emma (Mrs Sam) Smith of Scotia, Neb.; Lula (Mrs Frank) Kenworthy of Grant, Iowa; Mary (Mrs Lon) Zuber of Maryville, Mo; and a son Russell E Beals, who passed away while residing at Lincoln, Neb. on July 14th, 1941. "In 1905 I was married to Mr. Gerritt Stewart, who passed away in 1916. I leave surviving me, 14 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren, and 7 Great-great-grandchildren. Since my early youth I was a member of the Grant Methodist Church. I love to be in church services and was a active church worker down to now and over a period of some 80 years. And a call from my pastor was a source of great joy to me as I myself always tried to be an inspiration to all who knew me. "The outstanding event in my life was when I saw the soldiers march off to the Civil War in 1860. On our way Home that evening the little deers and fawns ran in the road ahead of us. Those two things, the marching soldiers and the Running wild deer, made lasting impression upon me and upon everyone else living this land of our fathers of that day."

When Sarah Jane and Ephrim married they moved just north of Milford to what was called the "Indian Farm" she would delight her grandchildren with stories about the Indians who still lived in the area. One special time she was making Lye soap in the front yard in a large iron kettle. A small band of Indians stopped in and made it clear they wanted to taste her soup. Trying to tell them it was not soup but Lye soap. They still had to have a taste, so she gave in. As they rode away, they were spatting out the Lye soap. It was the last time they ask for a taste of anything cooking in the front yard. As a child living in the original cabin on the Nodaway River the Indians would come by in the evenings and peer in the windows, at the children. Most all the Indians living in the area were friendly. Especially as William had learned their language many years before, this helped to make the white man a good neighbor.

One night a stranger came to the house asking for mail. Mr. Stacey did not have any mail for the person named and while he was engaged in conversation with the man, his dog was raising quite

a fuss. The stranger explained that he had tied his mule at the barn and he was probably causing the dog to bark. The next morning Mr Stacey found that a load of grain had been stolen from his barn while the stranger had engaged him in conversation .

In the year 1890 the Stacey moved to town buying a home just next door west to Dr. Maxwell's . The families became fast friends.
